Emergency Preparedness

For many of us, the memories of Tropical Storm Iselle and recent lava flow that threatened our Pahoa Town are still fresh in our minds. Since then, Our General Manager & Maintenance Crew have been taking part in the Cert (Community Emergency Response Team) Training and Certification. On top of that, they have acquired they're HAM Radio Licenses to keep connected when infrastructure, cell towers and landlines are down.

Nanawale Association is not an Official CERT Team yet, and this is where you folks come in! We need more volunteers who live in Nanawale to take the CERT Course Training. You will gain the wisdom, knowledge, experience and confidence in knowing what to do in many different types of emergencies.

Do you know the various methods in which to use to filter and purify your drinking water? Do you understand the methods of Triage, in First Response Search and Rescue? Do you have enough food, water and medications for you and your family? Are you personally ready for any disaster?

Through the recent storm and disaster response experiences around the world, we know that it is unwise to rely upon State and Government Agencies to save us or to supply us with the necessities like food, water and shelter. Everything we need is right here and right now! Scraping together your provisions during or after a disaster may be too late?

CERT may just be the thing you need to stay safe and save the lives of those you love and care about. CERT always insists on your personal safety (includes your home, family and possessions) 1st, and then if all is well with you and yours, you decide on whether or not to activate yourself. You will be better prepared and not become a burden or hardship on anyone else! CERT-ainly!
